CHARACTERS:

LOUISE REBECCA DANNY GRACIE THE BEARDED MAN

SETTING:

A room lit by candles. A hundred years ago.

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR PERFORMANCE:

The play is divided into two columns for ease of understanding.

- Each column is a conversation between two characters who are not aware of the characters who are speaking in the other column.
- The characters do not speak at the same time unless indicated by adjacent lines
- When one pair is speaking, the other pair does not "freeze" it simply represents a natural pause in the other pair's conversation.

The play's pace is quick and urgent.

Two women sit on opposite sides of a bed, facing away from each other. They both clutch their cups of cold tea.

Neither says anything for some time.

The room is lit by candles. Curtains cover the windows.

LOUISE I keep thinking about my sister.	
	GRACIE Sometimes I think about her.
LOUISE Who would she be now?	
	GRACIE And that night.
LOUISE Would she be here in this room?	
	GRACIE And the choice I made.
LOUISE Waiting.	
	GRACIE I miss my sister.
LOUISE Not able to leave.	
DANNY enters, frustrated	

DANNY

Who are you talking to?

LOUISE

Did you find the money?

DANNY

I still can't find it.

REBECCA enters

REBECCA

I don't know how you can be so sure.

GRACIE

Because he never made it back to put it somewhere else.

DANNY

Who were you talking to?

REBECCA

What's wrong?

GRACIE

Why must something always be wrong?

LOUISE

Did I ever tell you about my sister?

DANNY

You have a sister?

REBECCA

It seemed like you were talking to yourself.

GRACIE

I was talking to you.

REBECCA

I mean before I came in.

GRACIE

Doors are an illusion.

LOUISE

Had.

REBECCA

Yes darling you are very mysterious.

LOUISE

Tenses can be so terribly... terrible.

GRACIE

Don't call me darling.

REBECCA

We're alone.

GRACIE

People will get the wrong idea.

REBECCA

No one's here.

DANNY

I didn't know.

GRACIE

Habit can become hard to break.

LOUISE

Of course.

I would have had to have told you.

And we don't... talk.

We've never really known each other have we.

REBECCA

Of course.

REBECCA

You have to leave this room.

DANNY

Why don't you... well... why don't you come help?

REBECCA

You've been up here for two days.

LOUISE

Gracie never would have done this.

DANNY

This?

LOUISE

Hiding in a room like a princess in a tower.

She was brave. She... shone.

REBECCA

You could look too Darling.

GRACIE

I need to stay in here.

DANNY

Gracie was your sister?

GRACIE

This room was the last place I saw Louise.

LOUISE

Some places are like people: some shine and some don't.

DANNY

Louise. Darling.

You shine. Believe me you shine. I wouldn't be here if you didn't.

REBECCA

Louise was your sister...

The one who also died in the crash.

LOUISE

Don't call me Darling.

REBECCA

I'm sorry. I didn't think. I didn't think about the ghosts this house would hold for you.

GRACIE

You wouldn't be here if it weren't for the money hidden somewhere in its walls.

DANNY

I don't care about the money.

REBECCA

Why would you say that?

LOUISE

That's what my father said.

GRACIE

I just have to stay. Here. In my tower.

DANNY

Look are you at least going to come Downstairs when the guests arrive?

REBECCA

DANNY

Hello?

REBECCA

Who are you? What do you want?

DANNY

Where's Louise?

REBECCA

How do you know about Louise?

DANNY

I'm opening the door.

REBECCA

Don't...

The door opens.
Light pours in from the hall.
A bearded man stands in the frame of the door.
The other characters have disappeared and

Two little girls appear to be asleep in the bed.

The bearded man looks sadly at the two of them Before approaching the bed.

THE BEARDED MAN

Good night Louise. Good night Gracie.

He kisses them each And leaves. He lingers for a moment at the door before closing it and plunging the stage into darkness.
